

## HARMONY OF THE GOSEPLS - RESURRECTION ACCOUNTS

Mat 28:1-20	Mar 16:1-20	Luk 24:1-53	Joh 20:1-21:25
(1) In the end of the sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first day of the week, came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre.	(1) And when the sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him.	(1) Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came unto the sepulchre, bringing the spices which they had prepared, and certain others with them.	(1) The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.
(2) And, behold, there was a great earthquake: for the angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat upon it.	(2) And very early in the morning the first day of the week, they came unto the sepulchre at the rising of the sun.	(2) And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre.	(2) Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him.
(3) His countenance was like lightning, and his raiment white as snow:	(3) And they said among themselves, Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the sepulchre?	(3) And they entered in, and found not the body of the Lord Jesus.	(3) Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre.
(4) And for fear of him the keepers did shake, and became as dead men.	(4) And when they looked, they saw that the stone was rolled away: for it was very great.	(4) And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold, two men stood by them in shining garments:	(4) So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre.
(5) And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified.	(5) And entering into the sepulchre, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a long white garment; and they were affrighted.	(5) And as they were afraid, and bowed down their faces to the earth, they said unto them, Why seek ye the living among the dead?	(5) And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in.
(6) He is not here: for he is risen, as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay.	(6) And he saith unto them, Be not affrighted: Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified: he is risen; he is not here: behold the place where they laid him.	(6) He is not here, but is risen: remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Galilee,	(6) Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie,
(7) And go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead; and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him: lo, I have told you.	(7) But go your way, tell his disciples and Peter that he goeth before you into Galilee: there shall ye see him, as he said unto you.	(7) Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.	(7) And the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself.
(8) And they departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word.	(8) And they went out quickly, and fled from the sepulchre; for they trembled and were amazed: neither said they any thing to any man; for they were afraid.	(8) And they remembered his words,	(8) Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed.
(9) And as they went to tell his disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, All hail. And they came and held him by the feet, and worshipped him.	(9) Now when Jesus was risen early the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils.	(9) And returned from the sepulchre, and told all these things unto the eleven, and to all the rest.	(9) For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead.
(10) Then said Jesus unto them, Be not afraid: go tell my brethren that they go into Galilee, and there shall they see me.	(10) And she went and told them that had been with him, as they mourned and wept.	(10) It was Mary Magdalene, and Joanna, and Mary the mother of James, and other women that were with them, which told these things unto the apostles.	(10) Then the disciples went away again unto their own home.
(11) Now when they were going, behold, some of the watch came into the city, and shewed unto the chief priests all the things that were done.	(11) And they, when they had heard that he was alive, and had been seen of her, believed not.	(11) And their words seemed to them as idle tales, and they believed them not.	(11) But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, and looked into the sepulchre,
(12) And when they were assembled with the elders, and had taken counsel, they gave large money unto the soldiers,	(12) After that he appeared in another form unto two of them, as they walked, and went into the country.	(12) Then arose Peter, and ran unto the sepulchre; and stooping down, he beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves, and departed, wondering in himself at that which was come to pass.	(12) And seeth two angels in white sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain.
(13) Saying, Say ye, His disciples came by night, and stole him away while we slept.	(13) And they went and told it unto the residue: neither believed they them.	(13) And, behold, two of them went that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was from Jerusalem about threescore furlongs.	(13) And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, Because they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him.
(14) And if this come to the governor's ears, we will persuade him, and secure you.	(14) Afterward he appeared unto the eleven as they sat at meat, and upbraided them with their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they believed not them which had seen him after he was risen.	(14) And they talked together of all these things which had happened.	(14) And when she had thus said, she turned herself back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that it was Jesus.
(15) So they took the money, and did as they were taught: and this saying is commonly reported among the Jews until this day.	(15) And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature.	(15) And it came to pass, that, while they communed together and reasoned, Jesus himself drew near, and went with them.	(15) Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away.
(16) Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them.	(16) He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.	(16) But their eyes were holden that they should not know him.	(16) Jesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, Master.

(17) And when they saw him, they worshipped him: but some doubted.	(17) And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues;	(17) And he said unto them, What manner of communications are these that ye have one to another, as ye walk, and are sad?	(17) Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to my God, and your God.
(18) And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.	(18) They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.	(18) And the one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answering said unto him, Art thou only a stranger in Jerusalem, and hast not known the things which are come to pass there in these days?	(18) Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken these things unto her.
(19) Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:	(19) So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God.	(19) And he said unto them, What things? And they said unto him, Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, which was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people:	(19) Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you.
(20) Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.	(20) And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following. Amen.	(20) And how the chief priests and our rulers delivered him to be condemned to death, and have crucified him.	(20) And when he had so said, he shewed unto them his hands and his side. Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the Lord.
		(21) But we trusted that it had been he which should have redeemed Israel: and beside all this, to day is the third day since these things were done.	(21) Then said Jesus to them again, Peace be unto you: as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you.
		(22) Yea, and certain women also of our company made us astonished, which were early at the sepulchre;	(22) And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and saith unto them, Receive ye the Holy Ghost:
		(23) And when they found not his body, they came, saying, that they had also seen a vision of angels, which said that he was alive.	(23) Whose soever sins ye remit, they are remitted unto them; and whose soever sins ye retain, they are retained.
		(24) And certain of them which were with us went to the sepulchre, and found it even so as the women had said: but him they saw not.	(24) But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.
		(25) Then he said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken:	(25) The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.
		(26) Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory?	(26) And after eight days again his disciples were within, and Thomas with them: then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace be unto you.
		(27) And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself.	(27) Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing.
		(28) And they drew nigh unto the village, whither they went: and he made as though he would have gone further.	(28) And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God.
		(29) But they constrained him, saying, Abide with us: for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent. And he went in to tarry with them.	(29) Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.
		(30) And it came to pass, as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, and blessed it, and brake, and gave to them.	(30) And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book:
		(31) And their eyes were opened, and they knew him; and he vanished out of their sight.	(31) But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name.
		(32) And they said one to another, Did not our heart burn within us, while he talked with us by the way, and while he opened to us the scriptures?	(1) After these things Jesus shewed himself again to the disciples at the sea of Tiberias; and on this wise shewed he himself.

		(33) And they rose up the same hour, and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven gathered together, and them that were with them,	(2) There were together Simon Peter, and Thomas called Didymus, and Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, and the sons of Zebedee, and two other of his disciples.
		(34) Saying, The Lord is risen indeed, and hath appeared to Simon.	(3) Simon Peter saith unto them, I go a fishing. They say unto him, We also go with thee. They went forth, and entered into a ship immediately; and that night they caught nothing.
		(35) And they told what things were done in the way, and how he was known of them in breaking of bread.	(4) But when the morning was now come, Jesus stood on the shore: but the disciples knew not that it was Jesus.
		(36) And as they thus spake, Jesus himself stood in the midst of them, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you.	(5) Then Jesus saith unto them, Children, have ye any meat? They answered him, No.
		(37) But they were terrified and affrighted, and supposed that they had seen a spirit.	(6) And he said unto them, Cast the net on the right side of the ship, and ye shall find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes.
		(38) And he said unto them, Why are ye troubled? and why do thoughts arise in your hearts?	(7) Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt his fisher's coat unto him, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea.
		(39) Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself: handle me, and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see me have.	(8) And the other disciples came in a little ship; (for they were not far from land, but as it were two hundred cubits,) dragging the net with fishes.
		(40) And when he had thus spoken, he shewed them his hands and his feet.	(9) As soon then as they were come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid thereon, and bread.
		(41) And while they yet believed not for joy, and wondered, he said unto them, Have ye here any meat?	(10) Jesus saith unto them, Bring of the fish which ye have now caught.
		(42) And they gave him a piece of a broiled fish, and of an honeycomb.	(11) Simon Peter went up, and drew the net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken.
		(43) And he took it, and did eat before them.	(12) Jesus saith unto them, Come and dine. And none of the disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord.
		(44) And he said unto them, These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me.	(13) Jesus then cometh, and taketh bread, and giveth them, and fish likewise.
		(45) Then opened he their understanding, that they might understand the scriptures,	(14) This is now the third time that Jesus shewed himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.
		(46) And said unto them, Thus it is written, and thus it behoved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day:	(15) So when they had dined, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me more than these? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my lambs.
		(47) And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.	(16) He saith to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my sheep.

		(48) And ye are witnesses of these things.	(17) He saith unto him the third time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? Peter was grieved because he said unto him the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, Feed my sheep.
		(49) And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high.	(18) Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldst: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry thee whither thou wouldst not.
		(50) And he led them out as far as to Bethany, and he lifted up his hands, and blessed them.	(19) This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.
		(51) And it came to pass, while he blessed them, he was parted from them, and carried up into heaven.	(20) Then Peter, turning about, seeth the disciple whom Jesus loved following; which also leaned on his breast at supper, and said, Lord, which is he that betrayeth thee?
		(52) And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy:	(21) Peter seeing him saith to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do?
		(53) And were continually in the temple, praising and blessing God. Amen.	(22) Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? follow thou me.
			(23) Then went this saying abroad among the brethren, that that disciple should not die: yet Jesus said not unto him, He shall not die; but, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee?
			(24) This is the disciple which testifieth of these things, and wrote these things: and we know that his testimony is true.
			(25) And there are also many other things which Jesus did, the which, if they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written. Amen.

### Summary

1. After the Sabbath, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, and Joanna (and other women?) went the grave very early in the morning. The angel of the Lord rolled back the stone. The women entered the tomb and saw an angel (same or another?) sitting on the right side where Jesus laid. The women left quickly to tell the disciples (they encounter the risen Jesus along the way (see No. 3)). The disciples didn't believe them.
1(a). While the women were standing inside the tomb, two angels stood by them and testified of Christ's resurrection.
2. While the other women are still returning to tell the disciples (see Nos. 1 and 3), Mary Magdalene returned to the grave (it was yet dark). She ran and told Peter and John. Peter and John ran to the tomb and saw the linen clothes and napkin lying. Peter and John returned home but Mary stayed at the tomb. She saw two angels sitting at either end where Jesus laid. She turned around and saw Jesus. Jesus told her not to touch him because he had not yet ascended to the Father. Mary left and told the other disciples that she had seen the Lord, but they did not believe her.
3. As the other women were returning to tell the disciples (see No. 1) and after Mary had seen the Lord (see No. 2), Jesus appeared to them. They held his feet and worshipped him (apparently indicating that he had returned from ascending to the Father since Mary was not allowed to touch him (see No. 2)).
4. Jesus appeared to the two on the road to Emmaus. He testified of himself and broke bread with them. He disappeared and they believed. The two returned to the disciples, who did not believe them.
5. That same evening, immediately after the testimony of the two on the road to Emmaus, Jesus appeared to the disciples (except for Thomas) while they were behind closed doors. Jesus allowed them to touch him. He testified of himself from the OT Scriptures and ate with them. He breathed on them and told them to receive the Holy Ghost.
6. After eight days, Jesus appeared again unto the disciples, who were gathered again behind closed doors this time with Thomas present. Thomas saw and believed.
7. Some time afterwards, Jesus showed himself again to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias (Galilee). Jesus enabled the disciples to have a great catch of fish and they recognized him. Jesus ate with them and spoke with Peter.
7(a). The disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus appointed them. They saw him and worshipped. Jesus told them to go teach and baptize all nations.
8. Jesus led the disciples out as far as Bethany (Mount of Olives - see Act 1:12), blessed them, and ascended up into heaven.
